* Can be planted throughout Spring and Summer but will easily go to seed in hot weather. To reduce this risk give plants plenty of liquid fertiliser and water, best grown almost like a bog plant.

Do not transplant easily, best sown direct. If growing seedlings to transplant grow them in single pots to minimize root disturbance when transplanted.

♦ Lettuces planted to mature over the Summer months should be planted in semi shaded positions.
